# Morning Session

### Writing

Hop onto Seesaw and complete the, 'Get Active Week 1 Tuesday' activity.



Session

History - Traditions
If you have Seesaw follow the link to Inquisitive.
If not:
Sometimes families do special things while they are celebrating. These things are called 'traditions'.
Discuss with an adult the traditions your family has when celebrating.
Write or draw about traditions your families have for birthdays.



#### **TUESDAY MATHS:**

#### Materials you will need:

- · a selection of Australian coins
- · paper, scissors, sticky tape, pencils

In this lesson the student will be learning to:

- · use the language of money in everyday contexts;
- recognise that there are different coins in our monetary system.

#### **Background Information**

In this lesson, the student will gain the understanding that silver-coloured coins are cents and gold-coloured coins are dollars. The student will begin to recognise the different features and properties of each coin. By the end of the lesson, the student will be able to distinguish the different values of each coin.

Have a collection of coins available with one of each denomination for the student to use.

Look at the pile of coins. What colours are the coins that we have in Australia? (gold and silver)

Use the silver coins and match them to the pictures on this page.









The silver coins are our cents coins. Cents are not worth as much money as dollars.

What numbers can you read on the silver coins?

Point to the coin that is the smallest size. What number does it have on it? This coin is worth 5 cents.

Point to the coin that is ten cents.

Point to the coin that is twenty cents.

Point to the coin that is not a circle. How much is it worth?

Use the gold coins and match them to the pictures on this page.





The gold coins are our dollar coins. Dollars are worth more than cents.

What numbers can you read on the gold coins?

Point to the coin that is the smaller size. How much is it worth?

The two-dollar coin is smaller in size than the one-dollar coin but is worth more money than all of the other coins.

If the tooth fairy gave you a coin for one of your teeth which has fallen out, which of the following coins would you prefer? Circle your choice.









Have one coin of each denomination/value available. Allow the student to look at each coin as you read the following clues.

I am going to read some clues to you and you will have to choose the correct coin that I am describing.

I am a silver coin. I have a kangaroo and an emu on me. I am the biggest coin. Which coin am I? 50c



I am a silver coin. I have a lyrebird on one side and the Queen's head on the other. Which coin am I? 10c





I am silver. I am the smallest coin. I have a picture of an echidna on me. Which coin am I?  $5\mbox{c}$ 





I am a silver coin. I have a picture of a platypus on me. Which coin am I? 20c





I am a gold coin. I have a picture of kangaroos on me. Which coin am I? \$1

Try the coin rubbings below using a crayon or pencil with the different coins you may have at home. Take a photo of them to post on SeeSaw if you have a spare moment.



You will need a 50-cent coin, a 2-dollar coin, sticky tape and several pieces of blank paper.

You will be doing some coin rubbings of a 50-cent coin and a 2-dollar coin on a separate piece of paper. You will need to tape the coins to the paper (animal side down). This will stop the coins from slipping while the student rubs over the coins with a pencil.

Look at the Australian notes below (and real-life if possible). Tell me some of the things that you can see on them.











What are some things that are different about the notes?

What are some things that are the same about the notes?

On each note there are the faces of famous people.

The Australian coins and notes have many different pictures that are related to Australia. Other than people, what things are pictured on Australian coins and notes? (animals, buildings, plants, symbols representing Australian life)



Australian notes are called dollars.

On each note there are numbers. Point to one of the numbers written on the notes and then say the number. The student may need help with saying 50 and 100.

These numbers show how many dollars each note is worth. Point to the \$10 note. How many dollars is this note worth?

Now look at the pictures of the notes below. Draw a line to match the note with the correct amount. Use the numbers to help you.





In the search bar type in **baz** and press enter Hover the cursor over the book **Baz and Benz** and

click the Play button. Watch and listen carefully to the story.



- Tell someone what parts of the story made you laugh.
- List the emotions or feelings shown throughout the story. The illustrator uses different eye expressions on the characters to convey each emotion. Draw different faces to show how someone might use their eyes to convey other emotions.
- This story uses lots of comparative language. Think about your family members and think about who is the tallest, shortest, funniest, youngest etc.
- What does the word Nocturnal mean? Make a list of nocturnal animals.
