

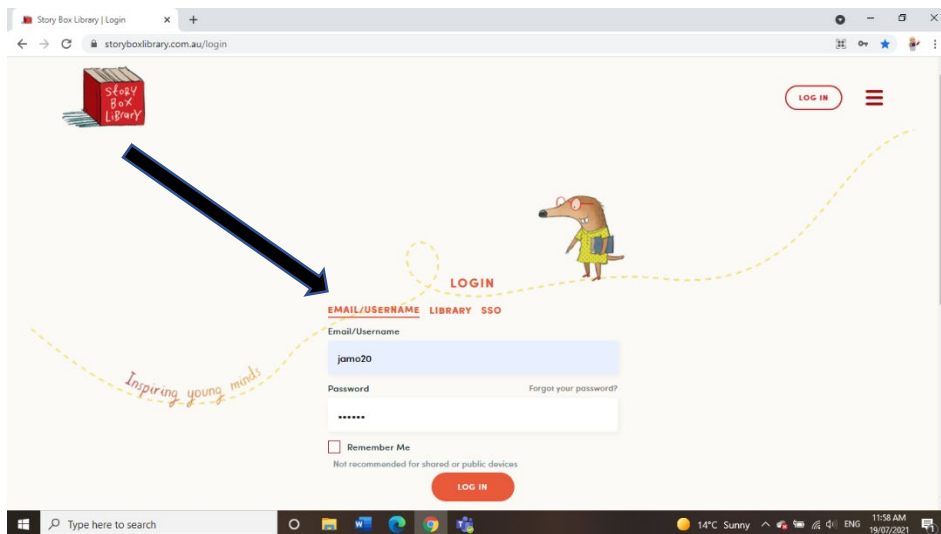
Using Story Box Library for At Home Learning

Story Box Library is an online resource that our school has an annual subscription for. All students and staff have access to this subscription on any device at both school and home. This online resource will be used for at home learning library lessons and students may also use it to listen to stories when they have some free time during their day.

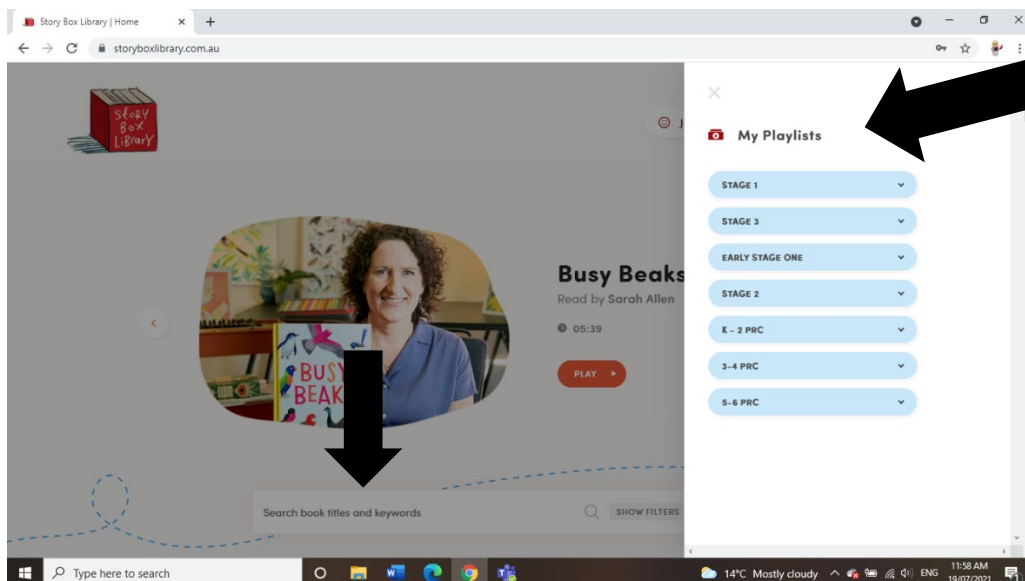

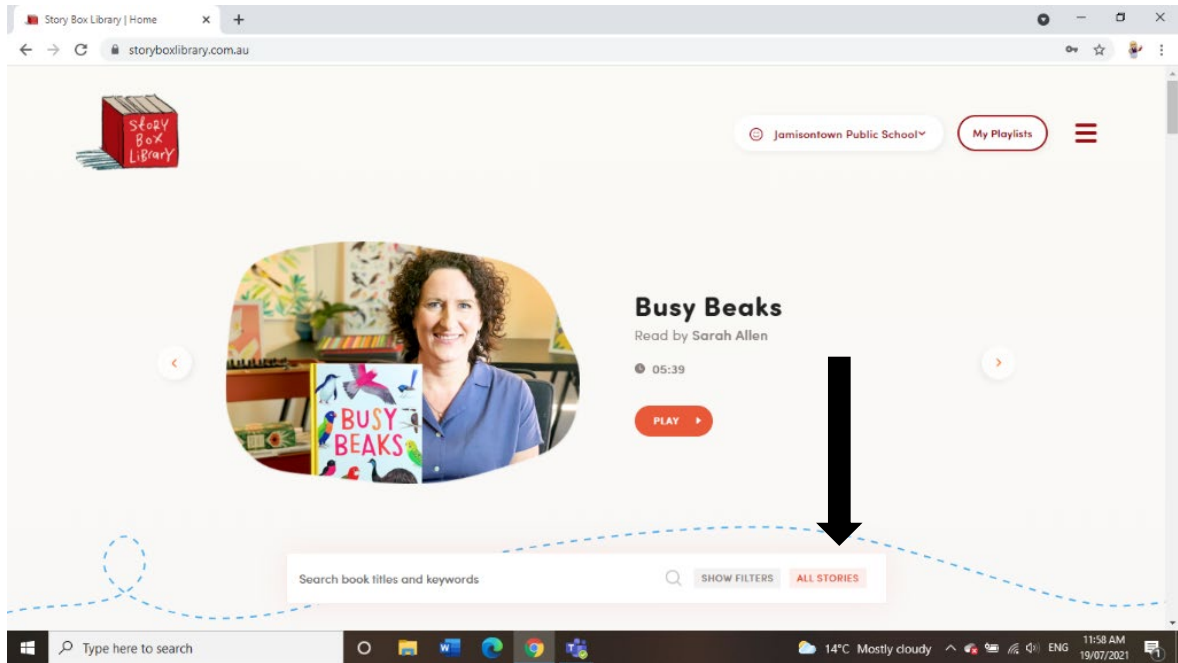

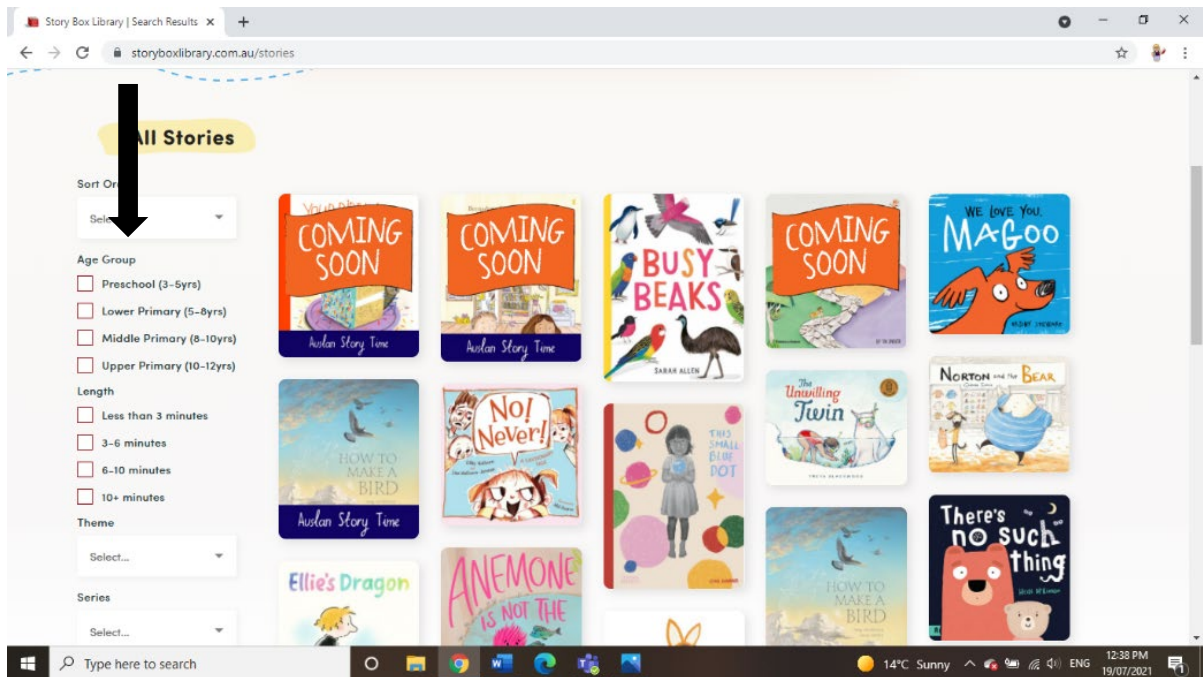
Once logged in it will take you to the home page. You may click on **My Playlists** to find the story that has been scheduled for the library lesson for each stage or put the name of the story into the **search bar** as per library lesson instructions.





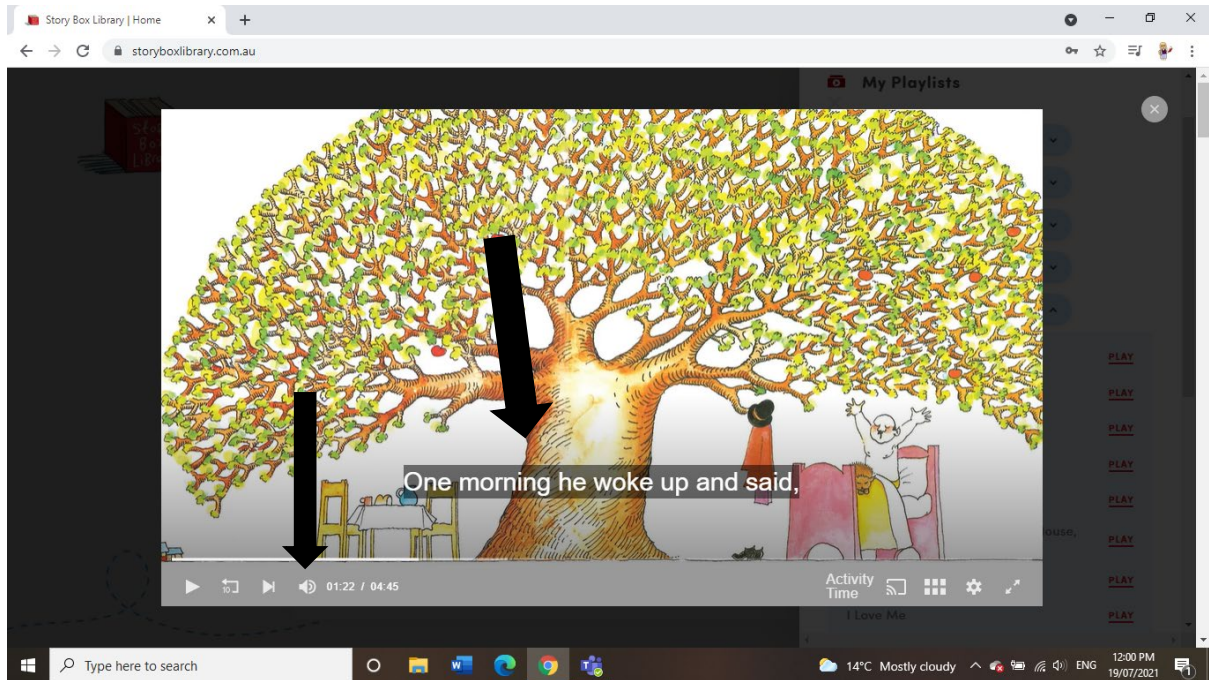
If you would like to browse stories for use in your free time, click on **ALL STORIES**.

You can then use the **filters** to look for age specific stories, by length of story or by themes.

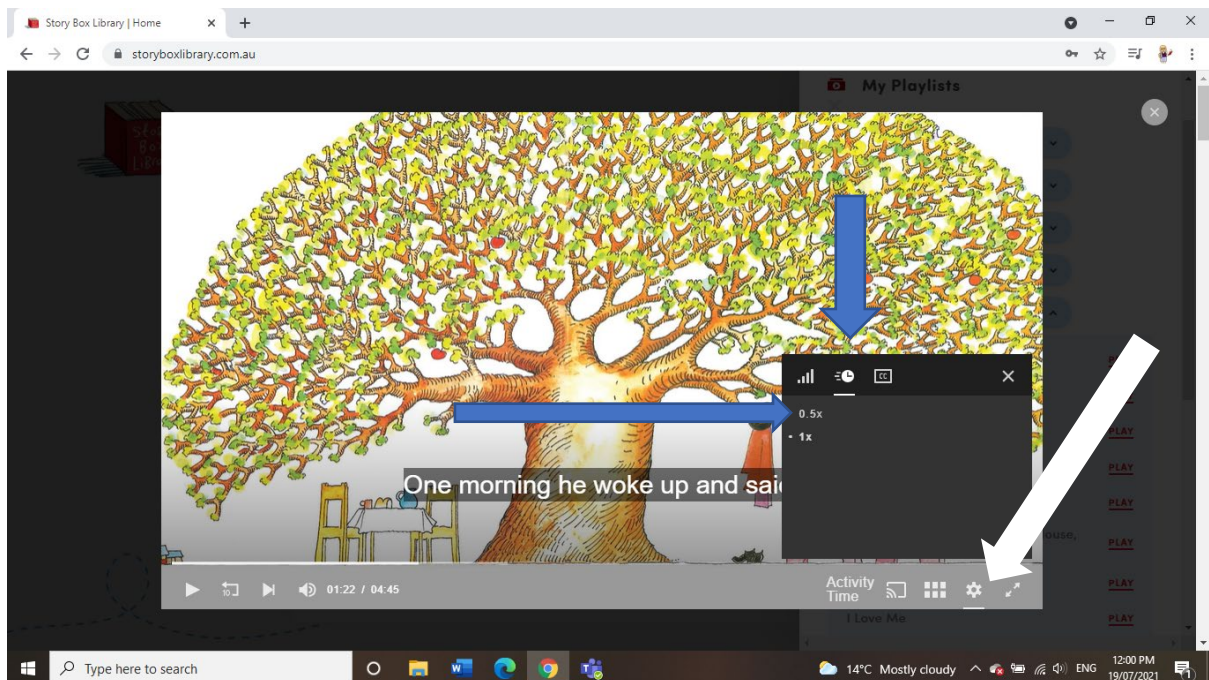


Other features that can be used in Story Box Library

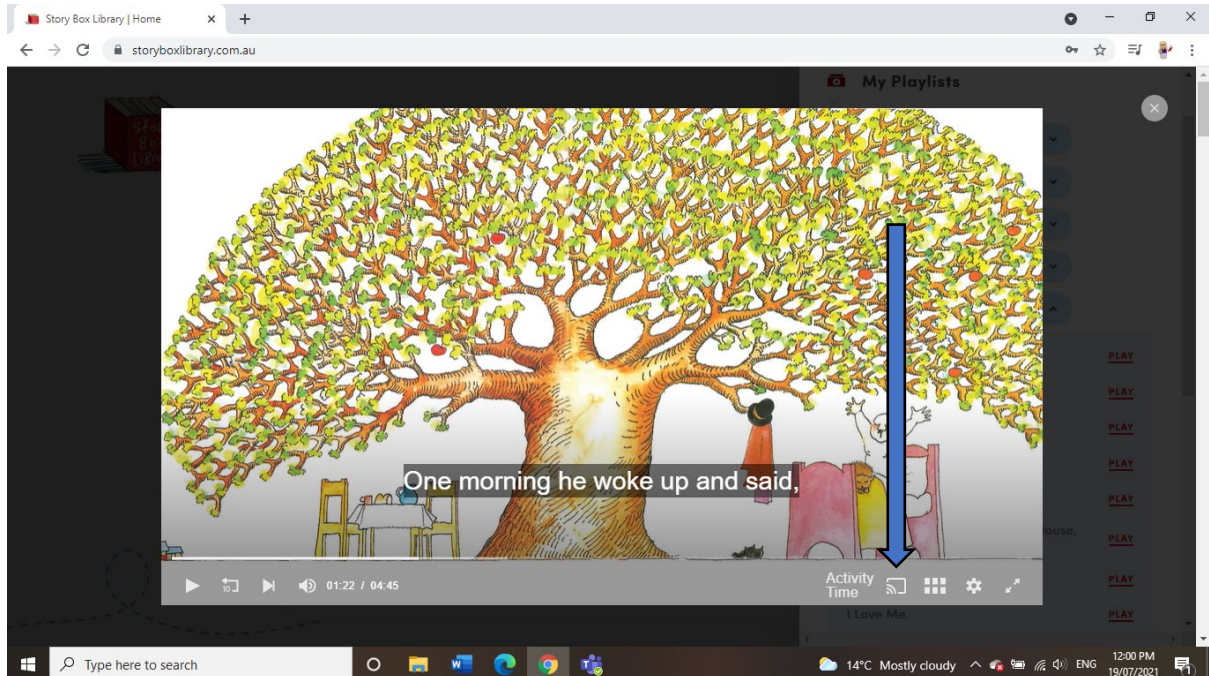
The **closed caption** option has been turned on which will allow students to read along with the text. If the student would prefer to read the story by themselves, you can **mute** the sound. The captions will remain enabled for the period of at home learning and cannot be changed by students.



If the student is reading the text, you can slow the text appearance down by half. To do this click **setting** and then the **clock icon** and then **0.5** as per screen below. Remember to change time back to 1 to listen to story normally again.

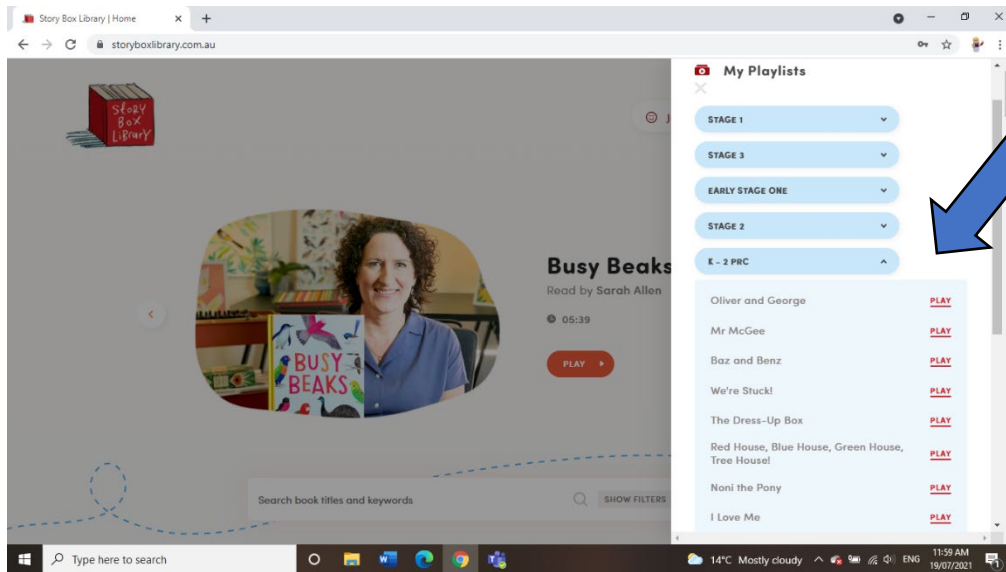


Another great feature of Story Box Library is the ability to Chromecast the stories to your TV. You will need a Chromecast device that plugs into your TV and an I-phone, I-Pad, or laptop to cast from. The Chromecast icon is situated in the bottom right-hand corner.



Premiers Reading Challenge Participants

Please note in **My Playlists** there are a variety of PRC stories in each Stage level that you can access to help you complete your challenge. Just click on **PLAY** to start the story. For the younger students it is acceptable to listen to the stories read by the presenter. For older students, the preferred option is that they read it themselves using the closed captions as explained in the instructions above.



If you are using a paper reading record to submit to the school for the Premier's Reading Challenge all you need to write is the title of the story you listened to or read on Story Box Library from the playlist. No PRC ID number is required.
