## Sight Word Flashcard Games

## Here are some games you can play with your children at home to help them learn their sight words.

1. Several cards are placed along a ledge. Children close their eyes. Parent removes one card- child tries to remember which card has 'run away'.
2. Parent flashes cards and asks child to carry out certain instructions when they see a word e.g. "When you see the word 'they' stand up and clap three times."
3. Stepping game- Parent shows a flashcard. If child reads word correctly he/she takes one step. When the child reaches a finish line count how many cards it took them to reach the line and see if they can better it the next day.
4. Put words on children's backs. Read the word every time the child turns around.
5. Snowman- Make a snowman as a child recognises a card... vice versa, rub off a piece of the snowman for each word recognised.
6. Postman- 6 cards are given out and your child looks at the cards and puts them face down on the floor. Postman asks for the word he/she wants.
7. Treasure Hunt- Ask your child to wait outside while you hide several cards around the room, then your child comes in hunting for treasure, they must recognise each word found before he/she can take it.
8. Apple tree- picking apples(words) off tree.
9. Word passed round small circle. As each child handles it he/she repeats it and/or makes up a story (about 8 in circle)
10. Fishing game- The parent draws a circle on the floor and places the flash cards in the middle, which are the fish e.g. Flash cards are put into the circle. Each card must have a small metal clip on it (e.g. paperclip) The child is given a rod ie string and magnet attached. He/she fishes for a card.
11. Humpty Dumpty's Wall- A wall is continually built with the words your child knows; when they have built the entire wall, they get to draw Humpty Dumpty on top
12. Stepping Stones- You draw or use string to create a pond on the floor and flashcards are placed on the pond to form stepping-stones. A variation of this is to have the words on cards shaped like water lilies. Individuals are selected to help Mr Frog deliver his letters by calling out the names of the water lilies.
13. Buried Treasure- Flashcards are placed on whiteboard/chalkboard. Child/adult is selected to hide treasure or make a cross behind one of the words. Child/adult is selected to guess where the treasure is. I think the treasure is behind....
